Yet statistics are essential for understanding our world. Statistics underlie the formulation of public policy, the allocation of public resources, strategies to address social ills such as gender pay inequity and racial disparities. Statistical skills are essential for scientific investigation, engineering, and design thinking. What's more, statistics are essential for achieving the global Sustainable Development Goals – the UN's blueprint for peace and prosperity for all the peoples of the world. If we can't see statistical evidence with our own eyes, we are at the mercy of those who do. On the other hand, when we learn how to gain numerical and statistical insights into our social environment, we will be prepared to join the conversation leading to data-informed decisions on how to improve it. So why not begin this learning in kindergarten by playing with blocks? This workshop will demonstrate an approach to statistics and other numeracy concepts that is engaging, playful, and uses tactile experiences and visualization, not mathematics, to introduce statistical concepts. This workshop began as a course project, grew into a PhD dissertation, and is now becoming instrumental in raising the level of numeracy among learners of all ages with a focus on early childhood. What Providers Have to Say	Since 2021, New Mexico has led the country in its efforts to make free child care universally available to its families. Families with income up to 400% of the federal poverty level became eligible for child care subsidy (an annual income of \$120,000 for a family of 4), and copays were waived for all families. The state also raised subsidy reimbursement rates for providers to reflect the actual cost of providing high quality care. Our research team at the University of New Mexico surveyed and interviewed child care directors across New Mexico to understand how these policies have affected their child care programs and ability to serve families in their communities. In this session, we'll share our study findings and discuss with participants their own experience-based perspectives. Early findings suggest that care providers have divided perspectives on whether efforts to expand subsidy access have been effective. While many providers felt that New Mexico's child care sector has never been healthier, significant administrative and policy barriers remain that impede the sustainable operation of their facilities. Understanding the ways in which state efforts to implement near-universal child care have been met with both success and frustrations can help remove access barriers to the affordable quality care that children and families in New Mexico need.
